Rubella - NHS.UK The vaccine prevents most – but not all—rubella infections during pregnancy. If a pregnant woman is not immune to rubella and catches it during the first 5 months of pregnancy, she usually passes the disease on to her fetus. Rubella in pregnancy - SOGC A pregnant woman can spread the rubella infection to her unborn baby. This can have severe consequences such as miscarriage or birth defects known as congenital rubella syndrome (CRS), especially if the mother contracts the infection in the first trimester.
